Fodder For Flamingos

This artistic creation is a reimagined version of Phoebe, the famed flamingo sculpture by Matthew Mazzotta.

Hazarika's work not only pays homage to its predecessor but also infuses it with a unique perspective rooted in the context of Mumbai's environment.

The choice of the bright pink hue, synonymous with flamingos, adds a layer of visual allure to the installation, drawing attention to the impact of human activities on the natural habitat of these majestic birds. The installation serves as a visual reminder of the intersection between urban life and the natural world, encouraging contemplation on the responsibility of citizens in safeguarding the ecosystems they share with other species.

Comprising benches crafted entirely from plastic discarded by the citizens of Mumbai, it becomes a powerful symbol of repurposing waste for a meaningful cause.

The octopus's sculpture at the center of this installation serves as a focal point, drawing both young and old individuals to sit and engage with the artwork.

As visitors rest on benches made from reclaimed plastic, the installation conveys a crucial message about the detrimental impact of plastic waste on marine life.

The project's objective goes beyond mere aesthetics; it strives to instigate a collective consciousness, urging people to reject single-use plastics and embrace more sustainable practices.







A visual odyssey of actions & Consequences

Central to the narrative is a coffee cup, symbolizing dormant consumerism triggered by external influences. It encapsulates the external world igniting consumeristic tendencies within us. 'Humanity' serves as a call for introspection, challenging individuals to bridge the gap between aspirations and societal demands. It stands as a stark reminder that every individual wields the power to shape a sustainable future through conscious choices.

By intertwining artistic abstraction with symbolic elements, the installation prompts viewers to reflect on their role in the ongoing environmental crisis, fostering a profound connection to the conveyed message.


